Five Bible classes are required each of three years to graduate plus a class in Comparative Religion.

Classes are offered January through October. You are encouraged to take additional classes.

- 1. Survey of the New Testament-** This course will give you a hands-on grasp of the entire New Testament. Each book is briefly prefaced giving authorship, date and purpose of writing. This is an excellent introduction to the study of the individual books of the New Testament.
